INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.39 dated 05.06.2016, registered at Police Station Sadar Rampura, Bathinda, under Sections 420 and 34 IPC.

Notice of motion has been issued in this case. Learned State counsel has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that though the allegations have been levelled against the present petitioner, Parwinder Singh and his mother, Baljit Kaur in respect of cheating of ₹4,10,000/- on the pretext of sending the complainant abroad, but on inquiry conducted by the Deputy

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Superintendent of Police, Sub Division Mour, it was found that Manparinder Singh and Satinder Singh have cheated so many people on the pretext of sending them on abroad. It is also mentioned in the inquiry report that they have taken ₹4 lacs from complainant-Jalandhar. The said inquiry report is annexed herewith as Annexure P-2.

The petitioner has been in custody since 08.08.2016. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The petitioner is a student, as argued by learned counsel for the petitioner. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
