This order will dispose of two applications for grant of regular bail, one (CRM-M-34165-2016) filed by Gurpreet Singh and the other (CRM-M-34274-2016) filed by Vikramjit Singh.

The FIR was registered at the instance of Anand Sharma alleging that when complainant along with his son and nephew was going

from Amritsar after receiving payment from the customers on 04.08.2016, five persons who were standing by the side of the road in their car, waylaid the complainant. One of the accused caught hold of the neck of nephew of the complainant. A sum of Rs. 1 lac was snatched from the pocket of the complainant. Another sum of Rs.70,000/- was allegedly removed from the dashboard.

Complainant Anand Sharma has furnished an affidavit dated 15.10.2016 to the effect that the petitioners are not those persons who had thrown his luggage and cash out of the house.

Learned counsel for the complainant has appeared to admit that the matter has been compromised.

Investigating Officer, ASI Gurnam Singh submits his ignorance about any compromise having been arrived at between the parties.

Without expression of any opinion on merits of the case, it is sufficient to observe here that the petitioners have been in custody w.e.f. 08.08.2016.

Both the petitions are allowed. Petitioners are ordered to be released on bail on their furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.
