AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

The petitioner has preferred this petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C., seeking regular bail in case FIR No.113, dated 17.06.2016, registered at Police Station Maur, District Bathinda, under Sections 306, 116, 323, 427, 506, 34 IPC.

The allegations against the petitioner are that she had developed illicit relations with the son of the complainant, even though she is a married woman with two children and the son of the complainant had purchased a plot for her and constructed a house for her. On the fateful day, she called up the son of the complainant, who went to meet her. After sometime, son of the complainant and the petitioner came back to their home. The son of the complainant was in a disheveled condition with injuries and his car was also badly damaged. He was holding a bottle of pesticide in his hand and both petitioner and the son of the complainant

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were saying to each other 'you have first'. In the meantime, husband of the petitioner came on the spot and arguments developed. During the course of arguments, son of the complainant consumed that pesticide and ultimately died.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has argued that the allegation under Section 306 IPC is notoriously difficult to prove and the petitioner is in custody for almost two months.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Jagsir Singh, has accepted the period of custody and the allegations.

In these circumstances, I do not deem it appropriate to deny the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

Ordered accordingly. Bail to the satisfaction of learned trial Court/Duty Magistrate.

Petition stands allowed accordingly.
