Petitioner, Umesh, has filed this petition under Section 439
Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.201 dated 16.10.2015,
registered at Police Station Hassanpur, District Palwal, under Sections 148,
323, 325, 341, 307 and 506 read with Section 149 IPC and Section 25 of the
Arms Act.

Notice of motion has been issued.

Learned State counsel put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and the complainant also put in appearance through his counsel. They contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner; learned State counsel as well as learned counsel for the complainant and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the allegations in FIR, vehicle of the complainant was waylaid by the accused by stopping his vehicle in front of the vehicle of the complainant and thereafter, two shots were fired on the vehicle of complainant. There are general allegations that the accused had taken away ₹5 lacs and also caused injuries to the complainant.

At the time of arguments, it is stated that injuries were given with blunt weapon and there are two fractures each on both the legs.

There are general allegations of causing injuries against the accused including the present petitioner. No specific injury on the person of complainant has been declared dangerous to life. The present petitioner has been in custody since 05.05.2016. The present petitioner is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is

allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
