FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 13.01.2016 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Patiala has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Uggar Singh and the accused persons namely Jora Singh, Kapoor Singh and Ant Ram, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, the fact that the offences for which the accused have been hauled up are not

of heinous nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.77 dated 08.06.2014 registered at Police Station Julkan, District Patiala under Sections 457/380/447/511/506/148/149 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
