Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.163 dated 26.08.2016, registered at Police Station City Kharar, District S.A.S.Nagar, Mohali, under Sections 15 (2) (B) and 15(3) of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956, Sections 420, 511 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 3(1), 4, 5, 1A, 6A and 29 of the Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (Prohibition of Sex Selection) Act, 1994 and Rule 9 of the Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (Prohibition of Sex Selection) Rules, 1996.

Notice of motion has been issued in this case. Learned State counsel has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

As per the FIR, there is allegation against the present petitioner that he is assisting or conniving in conducting unauthorized ultrasound on pregnant women. Sarabjit Kaur/non-applicant against whom allegations are that she conducted the ultrasound on pregnant women despite the fact that she was neither a registered medical practitioner nor an ultrasound operator, has already been released on bail, vide order dated 04.10.2016 passed in CRM-M-34300-2016.

The petitioner has been in custody since 26.08.2016. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
