Admittedly, charges have been framed and case is at the stage of leading prosecution evidence. All petitioners are stated to be on bail at present.

After arguing at some length, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that he may be allowed to withdraw this petition with liberty to raise all his pleas before the trial court at an appropriate stage. He further submits that personal appearance of the petitioners may be exempted.

Dismissed as withdrawn with aforesaid liberty.

In case, petitioners move an application for exemption of their personal appearance, same shall be considered by the trial court in accordance with law. The trial court may exempt the personal appearance of the petitioners on such terms and conditions as it deems proper to impose. Petitioners may be allowed to appear through their counsel except on the dates when their presence is necessary. It shall, however, be ensured that petitioners do not delay the trial in any manner. In such eventuality, court shall be at liberty to direct the petitioners to appear on each and every date of hearing and impose any other condition as it may deem fit.
