During the course of arguments, it transpires that the petitioner is an accused in another case FIR No.39 of 2015 on the allegation of having sold the property of Mata Parshad by impersonating as Mata Parshad by appearing before Sub Registrar, Balachaur.

Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that there are two sale deeds dated 22.4.2013 and 26.6.2014 which are the subject matter of the FIR and that the photograph of the petitioner is not there on the endorsement made before the Sub Registrar. As per the report under Section 173 (2) Cr.P.C., during the course of investigation, the Investigating Agency has gathered the material against the petitioner indicating that petitioner impersonated as Mata Parshad and sold 16 kanals of land situated in village Majot to Narinder Singh and another 15 kanals of land to Tamsa Rani. He also sold 16 kanals of land to Ramandeep Singh and 40 kanals to

Balwinder Singh vide sale deeds dated 28.2.2014, 22.5.2014, 28.10.2014 and 10.11.2014, respectively. The petitioner appears to be habitual of grabbing the properties by selling the same by impersonating as owner of the property.

No ground is made out to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner. The petition is dismissed. However, the trial Court is directed to conclude the trial expeditiously preferably within a period of 6 months. In case the trial is not concluded within a period of six months, it will be open to the petitioner to approach this Court again to seek concession of regular bail.
