FATEH DEEP SINGH, J.

The allegations against the petitioner in this regular bail application under Section 439 Cr.P.C. are that on 30.07.2016 the petitioner had assaulted his wife-injured Baljit Kaur. The contentions of the learned counsel for the petitioner that initially the petitioner was arrested on 5.8.2016 and upon his joining investigations he was allowed bail and subsequently at belated stage offence under Section 307 IPC has been added.

Though, on behalf of the State bail is opposed, however, appreciating the submissions, to the very query of this Court learned State counsel has duly acceded the fact that there is not tangible medical evidence to show any damage to the underlying organs pertaining to the injury purported to be covered under Section 307 IPC. Thus, being a

debatable issue and keeping in view that trial is not likely to be concluded in near future and no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner behind the bars, without adverting anything on the merits of the case, the present petition for grant of regular bail is allowed. Petitioner be admitted to bail to the satisfaction of the trial Court.
