The petitioner(s) have filed the present petitions under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.161 dated 25.09.2015 registered under Sections 420, 382, 323 & 506 read with Section 120-B IPC at Police Station Morinda, District Rupnagar.

The petitioners in all these cases entered into an agreement to sell with the complainant for the area of land measuring 72 Bighas 18 Biswas @ ₹26,25,000/- per acre on 14.07.2015. They fixed the date of execution of sale deed as 10.11.2015. As per the agreement an amount of ₹80,00,000/- was paid to the petitioners-accused as earnest money and the balance amount of ₹20,00,000/- was to be paid prior to 26.09.2015. Thereafter, instead of executing the sale deed having received the huge amount of ₹80,00,000/- the petitioners attempted to snatch the documents of agreement to sell from the complainant by putting some chemical in his eyes and snatched the documents from him with threats to kill him. The complainant ran away in order to save his life and went to the Civil Hospital.

The petitioners together having been conspired and having pocketed huge sum of ₹80,00,000/- have committed a very serious offence and in no case relief of anticipatory bail can be extended to them.

In the light of the above facts I find no merit in these petitions. Hence the petitions are rejected.
