During the course of arguments, learned counsel for the petitioners has produced photograph of petitioners, which is taken on record.

Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for issuance of directions to respondents No.2 and 3 to protect the life and liberty of petitioners at the hands of private respondents i.e. respondents No.4 to 6.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the petitioners are major and have performed their nikah in accordance with law. However, respondents No.4 to 6 are not accepting their nikah and are adamant to separate them from each other by resorting to illegal means. Learned counsel further submits that in view of imminent danger to the life and liberty of the petitioners, they had moved a representation dated 23.09.2016 (Annexure P-4) to the respondent No.2 i.e. Superintendent of Police,

Notice of motion to respondents No.1 to 3 only at this stage.

At the asking of the Court, Mr. Manish Bansal, DAG, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3.

Let requisite number of copies of paper book be given to learned State counsel during the course of the day.

In view of the above, without going into the validity of the marriage/nikah, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondent No.2 to take appropriate remedial measures, as warranted by law, on the representation dated 23.09.2016 (Annexure P-4) submitted by the petitioners.

In the meantime, necessary order be passed to ensure that no harm is caused to the life and liberty of the petitioners at the hands of respondents No.4 to 6.
