Since the liability to some extent has been admitted by the petitioner and the petitioner has got no resources to repay the same, provisions of Section 438 Cr.P.C. cannot be availed of by the petitioner.

With the assistance of learned State counsel and ASI Sohan Lal, I have gone through the police record, which indicates that on a number of occasions, the petitioner has admitted his liability and has undertaken to discharge the liability.

In view of the conduct of the petitioner and apparent liability, which is a combination of civil and criminal liabilities, no extraordinary exceptional circumstances exist to grant the concession of bail

to the petitioner.

In view of the above, the petition is dismissed without prejudice to the rights of the petitioner to approach this Court, in case the matter is settled with the complainant.
