The petitioner has been in custody with effect from 06.06.2013 on the basis of suspicion and circumstantial evidence that he had killed Gurnam Singh. The main circumstantial evidence gathered against the petitioner is an agreement of sale which was allegedly forged by the petitioner regarding sale of the property in favour of Dalbara Singh and Gurnam Singh and a sale deed in favour of Jaswinder Kaur. He despite the fact that he has been in custody since almost three years, the prosecution agency has not been able to complete the evidence. All the co-accused of the petitioner are on bail.

Out of total 54 prosecution witnesses, 12 stand examined. The material witnesses having already been examined, the chances of tampering with the evidence is remote.

Without expression of any opinion on merits, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

Police file after perusal is returned to the investigating officer present in the Court.
