This order shall dispose of both the aforesaid two petitions
wherein prayer is under Section 438 Cr.PC for grant of anticipatory bail to

the petitioners namely Rashpal Singh, Sub Inspector , SHO of Police Station Kulgarhi, District Ferozepur as well as Gurdial Singh in case FIR No.17 dated 22.09.2015 for offences punishable under Sections 7, 13(1)(A)(D) read with Section 13(2) of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988, Sections 170, 419, 420, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of Indian Penal Code registered with Police Station Vigilance Bureau, Ferozepur, who had demanded a bribe of Rs.25,000/- for helping the complainant party otherwise accused in FIR No.67 dated 30.04.2015 for commission of offencees punishable under Sections 336, 323, 506, 148, 149 of Indian Penal Code and Section 25 and 27 of the Arms Act. A sum of Rs.15,000/- was received by co-accused Gurdial Singh. The further allegation is that the aforesaid co-accused Gurdial Singh who is dismissed Head Constable from Punjab Police had acted as a serving personnel and conducted investigation by visiting the hospital to record the statement of the injured persons in FIR No.67 dated 30.04.2015.

Counsel for the parties heard at length.

Keeping in view the nature and gravity of the offences, no case for grant of anticipatory bail to both the petitioners is made out.

Accordingly both the aforesaid petitions are dismissed.
