The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No. 226 dated 03.06.2016, registered under Sections 304-B, 34 IPC, Women Police Station Model Town Rewari, District Rewari.

Counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner got married to the deceased in January, 2016 and though the marriage was only for five months but all was well and the deceased and the petitioner were travelling to Delhi and were going to her parent's house and they stopped for food on the way and there are CCTV footage which shows them leaving after taking food and then the girl asked the petitioner to stop the vehicle and she crossed the road and went to a chemist shop and purchased some poison and consumed it and the husband immediately took her to the hospital which was three kilometers away. It was urged that the deceased

had sent a Whatsapp message to her mother before consuming poison, which is referred to the petition. It was urged that the time when the medicine is purchased is also available in the CCTV footage.

The State counsel states that earlier also a complaint had been given in May, 2016 and the death is within seven years of marriage.

The counsel for the petitioner states that a complaint was given in May, 2016 but thereafter Sapna had given an affidavit (Annexure P-5) and she had mentioned that the injuries which were shown in the MLR were false and the husband had not given her any beating and if anything happened to her in the future she herself would be responsible.

The couple had started from Rewari and they were proceeding to Delhi. There are some photographs of their trip to Goa. Counsel for the petitioner had also stated that the deceased had a abnormal behavior and she had consumed nail polish remover in the Goa trip and tried to commit suicide. She had suicidal tendencies.

The CCTV footage shows the girl entering the chemist shop after 1:00 PM. She had given the message to her mother before 1:00 PM. Without commenting upon the merits of the case and as the trial will take time, the petition is allowed and the petitioner is directed to be released on regular bail on execution of adequate personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of trial Court/Duty Magistrate with a rider that the petitioner would not tamper with evidence.
