This order shall dispose of aforesaid two petitions i.e
CRM No. M-35934 of 2014, filed by Kikkar Singh and others and
CRM No. M-6839 of 2016, filed by Gurdeep Singh and others.

2. CRM No. M-35934 of 2014 has been filed under Section
482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of FIR No. 103,

dated 21.10.2010, under Sections 452, 323, 148 and 149 IPC, Police Station Mamdot, District Ferozepur (Annexure P-1), on the basis of compromise dated 11.10.2014.

3. CRM No. M-6839 of 2016, has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of a cross case registered under Sections 323, 148 and 149 IPC, Section 326 IPC (added later on) vide rapat No. 18, dated 21.10.2010, Police Station Mamdot in case FIR No. 103, dated 21.10.2010, under Sections 452, 323, 148, 149 IPC, Police Station Mamdot, District Ferozepur and subsequent proceedings arises therefrom, in view of the compromise dated 05.01.2016.

4. Reports of learned trial Court have been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that the compromise appears to be genuine and valid one which has ex-facie been entered into by the parties with their free volition, without any inducement or threat. Even otherwise, matter involved is personal in nature, which stood amicably settled.

5. So, in view of above circumstances, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for their benefit and will bring peace and harmony between them.

6. Consequently, both petitions are allowed and FIR No. 103, dated 21.10.2010, under Sections 452, 323, 148 and 149 IPC, Police Station Mamdot, District Ferozepur (Annexure P-1), as also

cross case registered under Sections 323, 148 and 149 IPC, Section 326 IPC (added later on) vide rapat No. 18, dated 21.10.2010, Police Station Mamdot in case FIR No. 103, dated 21.10.2010, under Sections 452, 323, 148, 149 IPC, Police Station Mamdot, District Ferozepur, as well as all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed qua the petitioner(s).
