This order shall dispose of aforesaid two petitions i.e
CRM No. M-35881 of 2015, filed by Balbir Singh and others and
CRM No. M-35892 of 2015, filed by Manjeet Kaur and others.

2. CRM No. M-35881 of 2015 has been filed under Section

482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of DDR No. 30(A) dated 28.05.2012 in case FIR No.54 dated 28.05.2012, under Sections 323, 452, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Nurpurbedi, District Rupnagar (Annexure P-1), on the basis of compromise dated 29.09.2015 (Annexure P-2).

3. CRM No. M-35892 of 2015, has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of FIR No.54 dated 28.05.2012, under Sections 323, 452, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Nurpurbedi, District Rupnagar (Annexure P-1), on the basis of compromise dated 29.09.2015 (Annexure P-2).

4. Reports of learned trial Court have been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that the parties have entered into compromise voluntarily and without any undue influence, pressure and coercion from any side. Even otherwise, matter involved is personal in nature, which stood amicably settled.

5. So, in view of above circumstances and in view of the pronouncement captioned as **Kulwinder Singh & others v. State of Punjab & others; 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for their benefit and will bring peace and harmony between them.

6. Consequently, both petitions are allowed and FIR No.54 dated 28.05.2012, under Sections 323, 452, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Nurpurbedi, District Rupnagar as also

DDR No. 30(A) dated 28.05.2012 in case FIR No.54 dated 28.05.2012, under Sections 323, 452, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Nurpurbedi, District Rupnagar as well as all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed qua the petitioner(s).
