JASPAL SINGH, J.

Instant petition has been preferred under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No.154, dated 25.07.2015, under Sections 452, 324, 323, 506, 148 and 149 IPC and later on added Section 307 IPC and Section 25/27 of the Arms Act, Police Station Sadar Jagraon, District Ludhiana (Rural), Punjab (Annexure P-1) as well as all the subsequent proceedings arising out of the same, on the basis of compromise dated

08.10.2015 (Annexure P-2).

2. Report of learned Judicial Magistrate has been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that complainant-Tarsem Singh has effected the compromise with all the accused with his own will and without any coercion or pressure from any corner. Even otherwise, the matter involved is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

3. So, in view of above circumstances and in view of the pronouncement captioned as **Kulwinder Singh & others v. State of Punjab & others; 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for their benefit and will bring peace and harmony between them.

Consequently, the instant petition stands allowed and FIR No.154, dated 25.07.2015, under Sections 452, 324, 323, 506, 148 and 149 IPC and later on added Section 307 IPC and Section 25/27 of the Arms Act, Police Station Sadar Jagraon, District Ludhiana (Rural), Punjab and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed qua the petitioners.
