Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the allegation against the petitioner was that he was found in possession of 19 types of allopathic drugs. The petitioner is registered with the Council For Allied Health Sciences (Punjab). The petitioner is qualified C.M.S. & E.D. Course i.e. Community Medical Services & Essential Drugs and, therefore, the possession of allopathic drugs was not unauthorised.

Heard.

The contention of learned counsel for the petitioner that the

petitioner was found in possession of authorised drugs is required to be established during trial. Therefore, without commenting upon the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to take all these pleas at the time of framing of charge.
