JASWANT SINGH, J. (Oral)

Prayer in this petition, filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C., is for grant of anticipatory bail to four petitioners, namely, Pardeep, Amit, Manjeet and Pawan, who have been booked for having committed the offences punishable under Sections 323, 452, 506, 34 of the Indian Penal Code and (Section 307, IPC added later on), in a case arising out of FIR No.0308 dated 19.05.2015, registered at Police Station, Sadar, Rohtak (**Annexure P-1**).

In the eye-witness account of the complainant-Anil, it is alleged that the present petitioners/accused, armed with *Hockey Sticks* and *Baseball Bats*, had inflicted injuries upon the complainant-Anil and his friends-Saveen, Parveen Saini etc. The reason for inflicting the injuries is that of selling unauthorized liquor by Anil and his friends in the Village/area.

It is submitted that all the petitioners were arrested and the weapons of offence were recovered during investigation. They were subsequently released on regular bail and subsequently, the offence under Section 307, IPC was added on account of the injuries upon the injured-Parveen Saini being opined to be dangerous to life.

It is contended that grant of regular bail was not misused by the petitioners and no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioners in custody under Section 307, IPC.

Learned State Counsel, assisted by S.I. Shamsheer Singh, submits that the challan is yet to be presented.

Keeping in view the totality of the circumstances, it is found that the petitioners also deserve the concession of anticipatory bail for the offence under Section 307, IPC, therefore, interim pre-arrest bail granted by this Court, vide order dated 21.10.2015, is made absolute.
