INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner, Gursewak Singh has filed this petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.132 dated 10.12.2015, registered at Police Station Rori, District Sirsa, under Sections 21-C and 22 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

Learned senior counsel for the petitioner argued that main accused, Sunita and her husband, Rakesh Kumar, have already been released on bail and allegation against the present petitioner is only of connivance with the main accused. Learned senior counsel has produced

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photocopy of order dated 17.10.2016 passed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court vide which accused, Sunita has been granted granted bail.

The petitioner has been in custody since 10.12.2015. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail; without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case; main accused has been granted bail by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and in view of principle of parity, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
