This order of mine shall dispose of two criminal petitions bearing CRM-M Nos.36745 and 36780 of 2015, being the version and cross version.

Both the petitions have been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.83, dated 08.04.2012, under Sections 307, 452, 323, 148, 149 IPC and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959 (Sections 307, 452, 148 and 149 IPC were deleted and Sections 336, 201 and 34 IPC were added later on), registered at

Police Station Phase-1, S.A.S. Nagar, Mohali and its cross version registered vide DDR/Rapat No.29, dated 08.04.2012, registered under Sections 452, 323, 324, 341, 148 and 149 IPC along with all consequential proceedings arising there from.

Report of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Mohali has been received to the effect that the statements of the complainant-victim as well as the accused have been recorded. It is reported that the parties have entered into a compromise and that the same is without any fear or pressure.

On behalf of the State, it is stated that since, it was no injury case, therefore, the offence punishable under Sections 307 IPC has been withdrawn and now the charges have been levelled under Sections 336, 323, 334 and 201 IPC and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act.

Since, the matter has been amicably settled between the parties, therefore, the FIR No.83, dated 08.04.2012, under Sections 307, 452, 323, 148, 149 IPC and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959 (Sections 307, 452, 148 and 149 IPC were deleted and Sections 336, 201 and 34 IPC were added later on), registered at Police Station Phase-1, S.A.S. Nagar, Mohali and its cross version registered vide DDR/Rapat No.29, dated 08.04.2012, registered under Sections 452, 323, 324, 341, 148 and 149 IPC along with all consequential proceedings arising there from stand quashed.

Both the aforesaid petitions stand allowed accordingly.
