INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.142 dated 27.02.2016, registered at Police Station Jhajjar, under Sections 148, 149, 188, 435, 436 and 395 IPC.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of Court, Mr. Vikramjit Singh, Addl. A. G. Haryana has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that FIR, in the present case, was got registered by complainant-Mahender Singh Saini. As per the prosecution version, on 20.02.2016, a mob of 1000-1500 persons armed with *lathi*, *danda*, *farsa*, *jelly* etc. came and suddenly attacked on his shop as well as shop of others persons, located in front of bus stand, Jhajjar. The electric

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metre of shops and some important papers were burnt due to fire.

The present petitioner has not been named in the FIR. Learned State counsel submitted that the present petitioner was seen in CCTV Footage, but without any weapon.

The petitioner has been in custody since 09.03.2016. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
