This petition under Section 438 of the Criminal Procedure Code has been filed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.145 dated 11.08.2016 (Annexure P-1) registered under Sections 307, 323, 148 and 325 read with Section 149 of the Indian Penal Code (in short 'IPC') and Section 25 of Arms Act at Police Station City Tarn Taran, District Tarn Taran.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that occurrence itself is doubtful as Amarjit Singh and Gurdev Singh who have been shown to be present on the spot and to whom specific roles were attributed, were in custody on the relevant date. He further states that co-accused Gurjant Singh has been admitted to interim bail by this Court vide order dated 06.10.2016.

Heard.

This is to be seen that although, as per the FIR, petitioner has allegedly given two gun shot injuries on the person of Lovepreet Singh, one on the right arm and the other on the face and neck but nothing is placed on record in support thereof. Petitioner in fact had deposited his weapon with

the Armory much prior to the incident. However it is clear from the FIR that two gun shots were fired by the petitioner which hit complainant Lovepreet Singh.

Keeping in view the seriousness of allegation in nature, no case for grant of concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made out.

Consequently, bail application stands dismissed.

Anything observed hereinabove shall not be construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of the case.
