Petitioner, Arvinder Singh has filed this petition under Section 439 (1) read with Section 482 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.110 dated 12.08.2016, registered at Police Station Kot-Ise-Khan, District Moga, under Sections 341, 355, 379, 323 read with Section 34 IPC and Section 379-B IPC (added later on).

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record. Police record is also available.

From the record, I find that FIR, in the present case, has been registered on the statement of Gurpal Singh with the averments that on 10.09.2016, when he reached near the fields of Madan Lal, there Charanjit Singh armed with stick and his son, Arvinder Singh, present petitioner empty handed were standing. Charanjit Singh raised *lalkara* and gave *dang* blow on the complainant and only push was given by the present petitioner.

The petitioner has been in custody since 19.08.2016. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
