The present petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (Cr.P.C.) for grant of concession of regular bail to the petitioner in case First Information Report No. 263 dated 23.12.2014, under Section 21/22/61 and 85 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act,1985 registered at Police Station, Lopoke, District Amritsar Rural.

Heard the submissions made by Mr. A.K. Vermani, Advocate representing the petitioner and Mr. Ankur Jain, AAG, Punjab representing the State.

It is submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner that the alleged recovery from the petitioner is 190 grams intoxicant powder which contained Aplrazolam. The petitioner is in custody for the last eight months and the trial will still take some time to complete.

Learned State counsel submits that there are total five prosecution witnesses, one prosecution witness has since been examined and four prosecution witnesses are yet to be examined.

Considering the fact that the trial is still likely to take some time to complete and there appears no plausible ground to detain the petitioner further in custody is admitted to regular bail during pendency of the trial, subject to his furnishing bail/surety bonds, to the satisfaction of Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate, Amritsar.
