FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 19.11.2015 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Sunam has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Jagsir Singh and the accused persons namely Pardeep Singh, Gursher Singh alias Gurseer Singh alias Seera, Gursewak Singh alias Happy Singh, Bhagwan Singh alias Gora Singh, Harwinder Singh alias Jassi and Harjit Singh alias Jeet Singh, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived

at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, the fact that parties belong to the same very village and the offences for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature as mere simple injuries have been given, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.156 dated 24.09.2015 registered at Police Station Chhajli, District Sangrur under Sections 458/341/323/148/149 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
