The present petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (Cr.P.C.) for grant of concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case First Information Report No.0069 dated 20.07.2016 under Sections 323, 326 of the Indian Penal Code (later converted into under Section 307, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code on the supplementary statement of complainant/husband) registered at Police Station Ghagga, District Patiala.

The accusation against the petitioner is that she had poured hot oil on the face of her husband.

The submissions made by Mr.Navmohit Singh, Advocate representing the petitioners, Mr. Ankur Jain, AAG, Punjab representing the State and Mr. Deepak Bhardwaj, Advocate representing the complainant have been heard.

Learned State counsel submits on instructions from ASI Sabh Singh that as per the medical opinion the injuries were superficial in nature and have been declared simple.

The petitioner is a young women. Nothing is to be recovered from her. As such, without commenting on the merits of the case and least any expression above may prejudice the case of either side, the petition for anticipatory bail filed by the petitioner is allowed. In the event of her arrest, she will be admitted to anticipatory bail to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer, subject to the following conditions:-

- (1) that she shall make themselves available for interrogation by the Investigating Officer as and when required;
- (2) that she shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer and ;
- (3) that she shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court.

The petitioner will appear before learned trial Court within 30 days from the date she is admitted to bail by the Arresting Officer and will file application for regular bail. On her doing so, she will be admitted to bail on furnishing bonds to the satisfaction of learned trial Court.
