JASPAL SINGH, J. (ORAL)

This is a petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No. 112 dated 24.05.2012 under Sections 364-A, 506, 120-B, 467, 468, 471, 420 and 34 IPC registered at Police Station Tabri, Ludhiana (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, including final report (Annexure P-2) on the basis of compromise.

2 Report of learned trial Court has been received, wherein, it has been categorically observed that the parties have entered into compromise voluntarily,

without any coercion and the same appears to genuine. Even otherwise, matter involved in these proceedings is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

3. So, in view of circumstances narrated above as well as the observations made in cases reported as ***Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and another***; 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and ***Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another (2014) 6 SCC 466***, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for the benefit of the parties and would certainly bring peace and harmony between them.

4. Consequently, instant petition stands allowed and FIR No. 112 dated 24.05.2012 under Sections 364-A, 506, 120-B, 467, 468, 471, 420 and 34 IPC registered at Police Station Tabri, Ludhiana (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, including final report (Annexure P-2) are quashed qua petitioners.
