This order shall dispose of the present petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.168 dated 27.10.2015, under Sections 420, 406, 506, 34 of Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Doraha, District Ludhiana.

While issuing notice of motion, the following order was passed by this Court on 12.11.2015:-

Heard. Criminal Miscellaneous application for exemption from filing the certified copies of Annexures P-1 and P-2 is allowed, subject to all just exceptions.

Main Petition:

Prayer in this petition, filed under Section 438, Cr.P.C., is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner, Parmod Kumar Bector @ Bittu, son of Gurdial Chand, resident of Bank Street, Ludhiana, who has been booked for having committed the offences punishable under Sections 406, 420 and 506 read with Section 34, IPC, in a case arising out of FIR No.168,

dated 27.10.2015, registered at Police Station, Doraha, District Ludhiana.

Learned counsel contends that the petitioner is neither the owner nor the partner or in any manner connected with the firm-M/s Adarsh Pal Diwan Chand, Commission Agent, Purani Dana Mandi, Tehsil Doraha.

Notice of motion for 25.01.2016.

Meantime, in the event of his arrest, the petitioner shall be released on ad-interim bail, subject to his furnishing personal bond in the sum of Rs.25,000/- (Rupees twenty-five thousand only) with one surety in the like amount, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer.

The petitioner shall continue to join the investigation as and when required to do so and abide by all the conditions laid down under Section 438(2), Cr.PC.”

Learned State counsel upon instructions from ASI Kimati Lal informs the Court that the petitioner has since joined investigation. That apart even the assertion made by counsel appearing for the petitioner that Parmod Kumar Bector was never the owner nor partner of the firm M/s Adarsh Pal Diwan Chand, Commission Agent has gone uncontroverted.

In view of the above, the present petition is allowed. Order dated 12.11.2015, passed by this Court, is made absolute.

Petition disposed of.
