This petition has been filed for quashing of the order dated 21.07.2016 passed by the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Rupnagar in case FIR No.66 dated 10.06.2012 registered under Sections 307, 392, 325, 326, 447, 511, 148, 149 IPC and for issuance of direction to the respondent for the release of passport and further permitting the petitioner to go abroad i.e. Australia and New-Zealand for honeymoon after his marriage.

Short affidavit filed by Gurmeet Singh, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police (Rural), Rupnagar, District Rupnagar on behalf of respondent No.1 is taken on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the dispute is between the father and brother of the father of the petitioner and the petitioner has unnecessarily been roped in. Apart from this the dispute is being settled between the parties.

Learned Deputy Advocate General states that the petitioner has repeatedly made applications to go abroad and in case the dispute is being settled as claimed he can always go abroad after the settlement of the dispute and therefore his prayer should be declined.

I find this to be a fair submission.

In the circumstances, the petition is dismissed.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending criminal miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
