**HARI PAL VERMA, J. (ORAL)**

Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of F.I.R. No.327 dated 7.11.2014 under Sections 148, 149, 323, 324 and 506 IPC registered at Police Station Chand Hat, District Palwal (Annexure P-1) and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 15.1.2015 (Annexure P-2).

This Court vide order dated September 22, 2015 had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court and the trial Court was directed to send its report qua the genuineness of the compromise.

Pursuant to the aforesaid order, the parties have appeared before learned Judicial Magistrate 1<sup>st</sup> Class, Palwal and have got their statements recorded. On the basis of the statements so recorded by the parties, learned Magistrate has submitted her report dated 30.11.2015 to the effect that the compromise has been arrived at between the parties voluntarily and without any fear or coercion.

The factum of compromise between the petitioners and respondent No.2-complainant has not been disputed by learned State counsel as well as learned counsel for respondent No.2.

In view of the above, no useful purpose would be served to continue with the proceedings before the trial Court in the instant F.I.R.

Following the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgment of this Court in *Kulwinder Singh and others Versus State of Punjab and another 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052* and approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Gian Singh Versus State of Punjab and others (2012) 10 SCC 303*, this petition is allowed and F.I.R. No.327 dated 7.11.2014 under Sections 148, 149, 323, 324 and 506 IPC registered at Police Station Chand Hat, District Palwal (Annexure P-1) and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed on the basis of compromise dated 15.1.2015 (Annexure P-2).
