JASWANT SINGH, J (ORAL)

Prayer is under Section 438 Cr.PC for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner Baliyar Singh in case FIR No.53 dated 10.05.2013 for offences punishable under Sections 419, 420, 467, 468, 471, 474 and 120-B of Indian Penal Code registered with Police Station Phase-8 Mohali.

The officials of the GMADA have lodged an FIR with the allegations that the main accused Gurmeet Singh along with his gang members are involved in forging documents and executing conveyance deeds of plots at Mohali by impersonation of the real owners. One of the such transaction regarding Plot No.MIG-758, Sector 64 Mohali owned by one Harmeet Singh resident of Karol Bagh, New Delhi of such

impersonation has been highlighted.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that the name of the accused has surfaced on the disclosure statement of Gurmeet Singh which is not legally admissible. He further submits that this Court has already granted pre-arrest bail to the similarly placed co-accused Gurvinder Singh @ Bittu.

Learned State Counsel assisted by ASI Gurdeep Singh submits that the case of the petitioner is on different footing than that of co-accused Gurvinder Singh as Gurmeet Ram had specifically admitted that the present petitioner had approached one of prospective clients Baljinder Singh, who had paid Rs.32 lacs for fraudulent purchase of the aforesaid flat. She further submits that regarding the admissibility the same is a matter of trial.

Keeping in view the above and the gravity of the offence, no case for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner is made out.

Dismissed.
