FATEH DEEP SINGH, J.

The allegations against the petitioner in this regular bail application under Section 439 Cr.P.C are that on 30.01.2014 he alleged to have assaulted the complainant Ashok Kumar causing injuries by means of stick and in the process has taken away Rs.2300/-along with his co-accused and also caused damage to the car.

It is duly admitted by the learned State counsel that it is pure dispute over money between complainant and the petitioner, who happens to be known to each other and that the very applicability of Sections 323 and 324 IPC in the light of the arguments of the learned counsel for the petitioner is debatable issue.

In view thereof and keeping in view that the culpability, if any, shall be determined at the time of trial which is not likely to be concluded in near future and no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner behind the bars, without adverting anything on the merits of

the case, the present petition for grant of regular bail is allowed. Petitioner be admitted to bail to the satisfaction of the trial Court.
