INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioners-Kuldip Kaur and Rajpal Singh alias Raju have filed this petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.65 dated 21.09.2016 registered at Police Station Dhilwan, District Kapurthala, under Sections 420, 406 and 120-B of Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued in this case.

Mr. P.S.Grewal, Deputy Advocate General, Punjab, has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that the main allegations against the petitioners are that they have taken the loan from the complainant, which they have not returned and thus cheated the complainant. The offences alleged against the petitioners are triable by Magistrate. The petitioners are in custody since 15.10.2016. They are not required for any investigation or

interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on regular bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of Rs.40,000/- with one surety in the like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
