Petitioners, Naresh @ Nashi @ Tira and Lata, have filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.280 dated 06.08.2016, registered at Police Station Ambala Cantt., District Ambala, under Sections 148, 149, 323, 436, 452 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared on behalf of the respondent-State and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the prosecution version, the petitioners alongwith co-accused put the house of the complainant on fire. At the time of arguments, it is stated that nothing has been mentioned in the statements recorded under Section 161 Cr.P.C. as well as in the FIR to the extent of loss suffered by the complainant.

Petitioner-Naresh @ Nashi @ Tira and petitioner-Lata have been in custody since 03.09.2016 and 04.09.2016, respectively. They are now not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as they are in judicial custody. Nothing is to be recovered from them. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioners in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail subject to their furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹40,000/- each with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
