Petitioner, Rakesh Kumar alias Keshi has filed this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.14 dated 26.01.2016, registered at Police Station Mehatpur, District Jalandhar, under Sections 308, 323, 341, 427, 148 and 149 IPC and Sections 307, 324, 325 and 326 IPC (added later on).

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and perused the record.

From the record, I find that FIR, in the present case, has been got registered by complainant-Jinder Kaur. As per the allegation, on 21.01.2016, at about 10.00/10.30 A.M, she alongwith her husband and other persons were going in a car. When they reached ahead of Kanagwal Bille and just behind Matha plot, there was one white colour car, already parked.

Out of the said car, five persons came out and approached towards the car of

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complainant. In the meantime, one more car also came from behind and the complainant and her family members were forcibly stopped and encircled. The present petitioner has been named in the FIR. He has been stated to be armed with rod and caused injuries to the husband of complainant.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case as well as nature and gravity of the offence and in view of the facts that main allegations are against the present petitioner and he is required for custodial interrogation, I do not find it a fit case where the petitioner is entitled for the benefit of anticipatory bail.

Therefore, finding no merit in the present petition, the same is dismissed.
