Petitioner, Gurdeep Singh has filed this 2nd petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.91 dated 14.06.2016, registered at Police Station Sadar Sangrur, under Sections 307, 326, 325, 324, 323, 148, 149, 447, 511, 506 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Notice of motion has been issued in this case. On the asking of Court, Ms. Shivali, AAG, Punjab has accepted notice on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that the present petitioner has been stated to be armed with *kirpan* and caused injury on the head of complainant-Randhir Singh.

Learned State counsel stated that the aforesaid injury has been

declared as simple in nature and no other injury has been attributed to the

present petitioner. She also admitted that no injury has been declared dangerous to life by the doctors.

The petitioner has been in custody since 21.07.2016. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. Nothing is to be recovered from him. Therefore, no useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
