For having been found in possession of intoxicant capsules, the petitioner was arrested on February 21, 2015.

It is mentioned in the petition that the petitioner was released on bail on May 26, 2015. Petitioner appeared in the Court on September 24, 2015 and the case was adjourned to October 19, 2015. It appears that the challan had not been presented as such the petitioner was required to appear during the remand proceedings. As the presence of the petitioner was not marked present on September 24, 2015 in the remand papers, non-bailable

warrants have been issued against him. The petitioner is not required to be taken in custody as the chemical examiner report has now been received to the effect that the salts tramadol and diclomine hydrochloride do not fall under NDPS Act.

Pursuant to the interim orders, the petitioner has already appeared before the trial Court.

In view of the above, the petition is allowed. Interim order dated December 15, 2015 is hereby made absolute. Petitioner will be deemed to be in the same status as he was on September 24, 2015. He will remain on bail against the bail bonds already furnished by him pursuant to the interim order subject to final decision taken by the trial Court on the basis of the report of the Chemical Examiner.
