For having been found in possession of 60 gms. of dihydrochloride, the petitioner has been in custody w.e.f. 31.12.2014, however, only one witness has been examined.

The quantity recovered from the petitioner being marginally higher than the commercial quantity prescribed and taking into consideration the pace at which the prosecution has been producing evidence causing prejudice to the right of the petitioner of expeditious trial, this petition is disposed of with a direction that the prosecution agency shall make earnest endeavour to produce all the witnesses within a period of three months after the next date of hearing fixed before the trial Court. In case trial is not concluded within the period stated above, the trial Court shall release the petitioner on bail on his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to its satisfaction.
