Prayer in this petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.91 dated 06.04.2016 under Sections 195, 307, 120-B IPC and Sections 25, 54, 59 of Arms Act registered at Police Station Rania, District Sirsa.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the fire arm injury has been attributed to the co-accused Mange Ram. There is no allegation against the petitioner in the FIR which was got registered by Mange Ram. He argued that the petitioner is in custody on the confessional statement of co-accused-Mange Ram. The petitioner is being named as an accused on the basis of confessional statement of co-accused, but no role has been attributed to the petitioner.

Learned State counsel, on instruction from ASI Jasbir Singh, does not dispute aforesaid fact. He, however, states that the petitioner has been arrayed as an accused on the confessional statement of Mange Ram.

Heard, learned counsel for the parties.

Since petitioner is in custody since 27.06.2016 and no injury has been attributed to the petitioner which may dis-entitle him for grant of regular bail and further, the trial in the case will take sufficient long time, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner in custody.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is admitted on regular bail subject to his furnishing of bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

It is made clear that the observations made hereinabove shall not be construed as an expression on the merits of the case.
