Petitioner's father is alleged to have taken loan from the complainant and issued a cheque of Rs. 8 lac which was dishonoured. A complaint has already been filed against him.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the allegations are vague and are indicative of a civil liability.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and gone through the record.

Perusal of the police file indicates that there has been money transaction between the petitioner and the complainant. It appears to be a combination of civil as well as criminal liability. Petitioner has joined investigation. Without prejudice to the rights of the complainant to recover the amount, in accordance with law, the petition is allowed. It is ordered that in case of arrest of petitioner, he shall be released on bail to the satisfaction of the

arresting officer subject to a condition that he will not leave India without the permission of the Court and will not, directly or indirectly, induce or threat any person acquainted with the present case.
