Prayer in this petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is for grant of regular bail during pendency of trial to the petitioner in case FIR No.44 dated 28.4.2016, under Sections 307, 325, 324, 323, 341, 506, 148 and 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Sadar, Kotkapura, District Faridkot.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the injury attributed to the petitioner is on the left arm of the complainant Kulwinder Singh, which is not grievous in nature. He states that the co-accused, namely, Jalour Singh and Lakhvir Singh have already been admitted on bail in CRM-M-24206 of 2016 titled 'Jalour singh vs. State of Punjab' vide order dated 7.10.2016 and CRM-M-41513 of 2016 titled 'Lakhvir Singh vs. State

of Punjab' vide order 30.11.2016, respectively, by this Court. He further states that the petitioner is in custody since 25.6.2016 and trial in the case will take sufficient long time. He states that the injury attributed to the petitioner is on the left arm of the complainant by Kappa blow, which is not found to be grievous.

Learned State counsel has filed the custody certificate of the petitioner and states that in the case in hand the challan has already been presented and the charges have been framed.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

Without commenting on the injury attributed to the petitioner and considering the fact that co-accused namely Jalour Singh and Lakhvir Singh have already been admitted on bail by this Court, coupled with the fact that trial in the case will take sufficient long time as the case is fixed for prosecution evidence, the petition is **accepted**. The petitioner is admitted on regular bail on furnishing of his bail bonds and surety bonds subject to satisfaction of the trial Court.
