Petitioner seeks the benefit of regular bail by filing the present petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C in case FIR No.64 dated 25.05.2014, under Sections 22/ 61/ 85 of the NDPS Act, registered at Police Station Makhu, District Ferozepur.

The recovery affected from the petitioner is of 100 grams of intoxicant powder and which as per the report of chemical examiner has been found to contain salt Diphenoxylate Hydrochloric.

It has gone uncontroverted that quantity in excess of 50 grams of such powder would fall under the commercial quantity.

Learned State counsel also apprised the Court that petitioner is involved in other proceedings under the NDPS Act. No ground for grant of benefit of regular bail to the petitioner is made out.

Petition is dismissed.
