JITENDRA CHAUHAN, J. (Oral)

This is the second petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, (for short, 'the Cr.P.C.') for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.255 dated 07.09.2015, under Sections 420, 406, 467, 468, 471, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code and Sections 4 and 5 of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2012, registered at Police Station City Barnala.

In connected petition bearing CRM-M-44201-2015, filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C., for quashing of the FIR on the basis of compromise between the parties, parties were directed to appear before the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Barnala, to get their statements recorded with regard to the compromise. In pursuance of said order, the statements have been recorded.

The learned State counsel on instructions, very fairly states that so far as the present petitioner is concerned, he is not involved in any other FIR nor any role has been attributed to him by the other complainants in the said FIR.

Heard.

Keeping in view the fact that the matter stands compromised between the parties, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed. In the event of arrest of the petitioner by the Arresting Officer, he shall be released on interim bail subject to the following conditions:-

1. That he shall make himself available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required;
2. That he shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer and;
3. That he shall not leave India without previous permission

of the Court.
