JASPAL SINGH, J. (ORAL)

This is a petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking quashing of FIR No. 198 dated June 05, 2015 under Sections 323 and 506 IPC registered at Police Station Sector 5, Panchkula, Section 34 IPC and Section 3 of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 added later on (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated February 02, 2016 (Annexure P-2) alleged to have been arrived at in between the parties.

2 Report of learned trial Court has been received, wherein, it has been categorically observed that the matter has been compromised between the parties without any coercion or undue influence and the same appears to be genuine. Even otherwise, matter involved in these proceedings is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

3. So, in view of circumstances narrated above as well as the observations made in cases reported as ***Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and another***; 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 and ***Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another (2014) 6 SCC 466***, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for the benefit of the parties and would certainly bring peace and harmony between them.

4. Consequently, instant petition stands allowed and FIR No. 198 dated June 05, 2015 under Sections 323 and 506 IPC registered at Police Station Sector 5, Panchkula, Section 34 IPC and Section 3 of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 added later on (Annexure P-1) and all subsequent proceedings arising out of the same are quashed qua petitioners.
