1. Prayer in this petition filed under Article 226 of the

Constitution of India is for issuance of writ of certiorari to quash the notification dated 15.11.2006 issued under Section 4 of the Land Acquisition Act 1894 (in short 'the Act') by invoking the urgency clause under Section 17 of the Act and also notification under Section 6 of the Act dated 24.11.2006.

2. Learned State counsel has filed an affidavit of Mr. Anil Kumar, Principal Secretary to Government Haryana, Urban Local Bodies Department, Chandigarh dated 12.05.2016, which is taken on record.

3. In para 3 thereof, it has been stated that keeping in view, the comments forwarded by the Commissioner, Municipal Corporation, Faridabad, the land is not vacant and has been purchased by several persons. Therefore, the acquisition of same shall not serve any public purpose. The impugned notifications shall be withdrawn by the Government accordingly.

4. In view thereof, the writ petition is rendered infructuous and the same is disposed of as such. However, the petitioners shall be at liberty to seek revival of the petition in case Government resiles from the affidavit filed in Court today.

5. This order shall also dispose of all the miscellaneous applications.
