Petitioner was convicted by the Trial Court vide judgment dated 19.10.2011 under section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act read with section 420 IPC and sentenced to undergo rigorous imprisonment for one year and to pay fine of ₹ 2,000/- and in default of payment of fine to further undergo rigorous imprisonment for one month. The appeal filed by the petitioner before the Appellate Court was also dismissed vide order dated 10.10.2012. Hence the present criminal revision.

The matter has been compromised between the parties. Today respondent-complainant Ram Kumar has received the payment of remaining ₹ 70,000/- as per the last order dated 17.3.2016. Respondent-complainant Ram Kumar has placed on record photo-copy of his driving licence as a mark of identification.

It may be added here that respondent-Ram Kumar (complainant) also stated that he does not have any other claim against the petitioner.

In view of the matter having been settled, as the offence is compoundable and according to the statement of complaint-Ram Kumar, the complaint having been withdrawn necessarily the conviction and sentence

recorded by the Trial Court and upheld by the Appellate Court is set aside and the present criminal revision is disposed of as having become infructuous.
