The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking direction to respondent Nos. 1 and 2 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner who apprehends a major danger to her life and liberty at the hands of the private respondents with a further direction to mark an inquiry in case FIR No. 367 dated 24.12.2014, registered under Sections 452, 376 and 511 of the IPC at Police Station Jandiala Guru, District Amritsar. Additional prayer has been made for the cancellation of FIR No. 368 dated 25.12.2014 which was got registered by respondent No. 7 against the petitioner and her husband.

A status report has been filed by the counsel for the State and

the same is taken on record. As per the status report, it is submitted that initially the FIR No. 367 dated 24.12.2014 came to be registered under Sections 452, 376 and 511 of the IPC on the statement of the complainant. During the course of inquiry conducted thereupon, offences under Section 376 and 511 of the IPC were deleted and offences under Section 354-A and 506 of the IPC came to be added on 24.06.2015. Further investigation in the case was entrusted to SI Surjit Singh who made every possible effort to arrest the accused-respondent No. 6. However, the said respondent had approached the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Amritsar and obtained anticipatory bail by an order 16.03.2016. The said accused has joined investigation and the interim order passed by the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Amritsar has been made absolute. After investigation, a challan has been presented which is now pending trial and fixed for 08.12.2016. As regards the FIR No. 368 dated 25.12.2014, the petitioner has sought cancellation of the said FIR. Learned counsel for the State relying upon the earlier status report submits that a cancellation report has already been preferred.

In view of the fact that the challan has been presented and charges are to be framed, no further orders are called for in this case and the same is disposed of accordingly.
