For the reasons mentioned in the application, it is allowed and 45 days delay in filing the revision petition stands condoned.

CRR No.2541 of 2013

The present revision is against the concurrent findings of two Courts below whereby the accused-respondent Nos.2 to 5 were acquitted of the offences punishable under Sections 420, 467, 468, 477 and 120B IPC.

In nutshell, the petitioner claims that Gurnam Singh had executed a will in his favour. Accused claims that Gurnam Singh had executed sale deed in his favour, which according to the complainant is false.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and have also carefully gone through the file.

It comes out that Gurnam Singh is now dead. Before the lower Court, neither standard document was produced nor any expert was examined to compare the disputed signatures with the standard signatures of Gurnam Singh to prove that the sale deed is forged. Even Tehsildar was not examined to show that actual Gurnam Singh did not appear before him. The sale deed is duly registered in accordance with law. Civil litigation is pending between the parties. Therefore, merely on the oral evidence, it cannot be said that signatures of Gurnam Singh on the sale deed are forged or that Gurnam Singh made to sign the sale deed on the basis of misrepresentation or fraud. There is nothing to differ with the concurrent view taken by both the Courts below.

Resultantly, the present revision petition stands dismissed.
